All you need to be a Parish Councillor is to be aged 18 or over and

- Either be on the electoral roll for Rookley
- Or, for the last 12 months, have occupied as owner or tenant any land or premises within the Parish
- Or, for the last 12 months, your main place of work has been within the Parish
- Or, for the last 12 months, have lived in the Parish or within three miles of it

The Council meets in the evening of the first Wednesday of each month, except January and August, at Rookley Village Hall. Parish Councillors make decisions and the Parish Clerk deals with all administration and legal issues. Caroline Gladwin, the member of the Isle of Wight Council for the Central Rural Ward is invited to all meetings.
